



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UNDER THE STARS |

Lake Pepin Pearl Button Company |

The local clamming industry thrived from 1914 to 1920. At the Lake Pepin Pearl Button Company, round 'blanks' were cut from clam shells and sent to a button manufacturing facility in Muscatine, Iowa. Some



clams produced pearls which were prized as gems and used for making jewelry. During that time, natural beds of mussels were depleted by overharvesting. That, plus the introduction of plastic buttons, led to the demise of the clamming industry. (source: Lake City Historical Society)

Today, the Lake Pepin Pearl Button Company is one of the most popular shopping destinations in Lake City. They offer an eclectic mix of apparel and accessories, antiques and collectables, gift items, nautical and home décor.

HISTORY BREAK |

Lake City has three properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places: the 1872 James C. and Agnes M. Stout House, the 1899 Lake City City Hall, and the 1910 Williamson – Russell – Rahilly House.

Many historic artifacts belonging to the Lake City Historical Society are on display from 8–4:30 M–F in the 2nd floor ballroom of the Lake City City Hall.



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DRIVE A LITTLE. SAVE A LOT!

In *Little House In the Big Woods*, Laura Ingalls Wilder describes her first look at the lake: “After a long time Laura began to see glimpses of blue water between the trees.” ... “Then all at once the road came out of the woods and Laura saw the lake. It was as blue as the sky, and it went to the edge of the world. As far as she could see, there was nothing but flat, blue water.” Our lake makes another appearance in *Little House on the Prairie* in the chapter “Going West.”





SUPERB FISHING, YEAR ROUND |

Fishing is one of the most popular pastimes in the area. Situated on one of Minnesota's most prolific fisheries, boasting over 85 different species, anglers will quickly understand why we were chosen to host the Cabela's 2021 World Walleye Championship and the 2024 Minnesota Governor's Fishing Opener.



There's plenty of opportunity to drop a line in the water for experienced and beginner anglers. Shore fishing is popular in Lake City, and there are 3 public boat launches right in town. Many



talented and knowledgeable local guides are around to remove the guesswork from your adventure, and boat rentals are readily available. Several beautiful trout streams in the area bring fly fishers as well. Anglers can also challenge themselves (or just have fun) at a host of contests in both summer and winter run by area sportsman's clubs, which always include kid competitions as well.

Locals are quick to let visitors in on our "little secret". You don't have to wait until May's opener to get your walleye fix - you can legally fish walleye all year long on Lake Pepin.



ICE FISHING |

The best of this enduring winter pastime is right on our front porch. The locals target blue gills, bass and lunker walleye and pike. There's easy access for those who need to unload their fish house.

MESSING ABOUT IN BOATS |

Recreational boating reigns supreme on Lake Pepin. Our playground is a 22-mile-long, 2-mile-wide natural broadening of the Mississippi River covering 30,000 acres and surrounded by majestic bluffs.

On any given day in the spring, summer, or fall, the lake is buzzing with sailboats, pontoons, cabin cruisers, kayaks, and canoes, and yet the sheer size of Lake Pepin allows for a plentitude of elbow room for boaters to feel like they have the lake to themselves.

BYO BOAT |

Lake City makes it easy to get your craft on the water. **The Lake City Marina, Hok-Si-La Boat Launch, Roschen Park Landing, and the Florence Township Public Landing** are all great options.

During the day, you can beach your craft at one of our many lakefront city parks get lunch and explore downtown. Lake City Marina offers transient boat parking for overnight stays.





LEARN TO SAIL |

Lake City Yacht Club Sailing School

teaches new sailors the basics of small boat seamanship. Gain both classroom knowledge and on-the-water instruction to give you confidence in the finer arts of sailing.

Or just go for a ride on one of **Sail Pepin's** four daily scheduled Lake Pepin sailboat cruises from Pepin and Lake City. They've been providing sailboat rides, sailing instruction and corporate and youth sailing team-building programs since 1997.

All proceeds benefit the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society of America.



WATER SKI | LAKE PEPIN

“THE BIRTHPLACE OF WATERSKIING”



At the young age of 19, Ralph successfully took on Lake Pepin with his home-made water skis constructed of pine boards measuring a whopping eight feet long and nine inches wide. Then, on July 2, 1922, Ralph Samuelson performed the sport for the first time in front of an audience on Lake Pepin, effectively putting Lake City and Samuelson in the history books.

Samuelson performed many water skiing exhibitions here in Lake City for which the City would charge an admission fee. Ralph was never paid any money for his Lake City Exhibitions, instead he insisted that the money be used to buy land which is now Marina Point, Ohuta Park, and the site of the Lake City Marina.



The first to be pulled behind an airplane on water skis, Samuelson hurdled across the water at the mind-boggling speed of 80 mph. It's estimated that when being pulled behind the airplane, he would jump the wake and sometimes fly as much as 50 feet in the air.

Ralph never wore a life vest while water skiing [not smart, but true].

Fun Facts About Water Skiing In Lake City

In 1966, after much debate around the world, the American Water Ski Association declared that it was indeed Ralph Samuelson on July 2, 1922, who invented water skiing. No one has been able to predate any claim to that fact.

Ralph was also first to jump off of a floating jump and to ever ski on one ski.

There are millions of water skiing specific enthusiasts around the world, and today, more than 20 million people in the US alone call themselves towed water sports enthusiasts.

In 2024, the USA Water Ski & Wake Sport Foundation announced the Ralph Samuelson Commemorative Boys 3 Scholarship. Funded by “Destination Lake City, the Birthplace of Water Skiing,” the Boys 3 Scholarship is awarded to the National Overall Title winner at the AWSA National Water Ski Championships each year.



We acknowledge that the area now known as Lake City is located on the traditional and ancestral homelands of the Dakota people. We recognize the significance of Lake Pepin and the surrounding region to the Dakota people and the contemporary presence of the Prairie Island Indian Community. We offer this acknowledgment to honor the Dakota people, their relationship to this land, and their rich history.

Steps taken by Lake City For Lake City, this acknowledgment is particularly meaningful due to recent actions taken by the city to address past injustices. In September 2023, the Lake City Council voted unanimously to return three acres of land containing 11 burial mounds to the Prairie Island Indian Community. This act of returning land was an important step toward reconciliation and a way to honor the historical significance of the site. Former Mayor Mark Nichols noted the process was positive and educational, improving relations with the Prairie Island Indian Community.

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


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THE LEGEND OF PEPIE

The legend of Pepie tells of a large, serpentlike creature which lives in the shadowy depths of Lake Pepin.

There have been a lot of people over the years who said they saw it, or something they couldn't explain.

Legend has it that the Dakota, who lived along the scenic, wide stretch of river, beached their birch bark canoes for thicker dugout canoes when traveling on Lake Pepin. The reason? There were large creatures lurking in the lake that had easily punctured the thinner birch canoes.

“The early Native Americans warned of a deadly beast inhabiting the waters of Lake Pepin along the Mississippi River,” say Chad Lewis and Noah Voss, authors of **PEPIE – The Lake Monster of the Mississippi River**. “A lake monster was seen swimming on Lake Pepin” on April 28, 1871, according to the Minnesota Historical Society’s **Book of Days Almanac**.

The former captain of the 125-passenger paddle-wheeler Pearl of the Lake, says he has seen Pepie and believes the creature deserves respect and recognition.

The latest twist in the tale is that anyone who can hook, net or capture Pepie on film could earn a \$50,000 reward. Collecting the reward will require a good photograph or a bit of fin or skin. If the photo is determined to be authentic, or if a University of Minnesota biologist can confirm the DNA came from a monster, fame and fortune will certainly follow.



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
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
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
